# INTERIOR DESIGN First Semester Registration Information Packet



## How do I register for classes?

Never fear! This packet includes directions for registering for your first semester at ECU!

- 1. Make sure you follow the instructions exactly.
- 2. Do not wait until your Orientation to register.
- 3. At your Orientation, an Academic Advisor will review your schedule.
  - a. If a schedule change is needed, you can do so through the first week of the fall semester.
- 4. Courses fill up quickly, so register for your classes as soon as possible.
- 5. If you were an Early College or Dual Enrollment student, make sure you submit a **final**, **official** transcript from your community college/university in addition to your high school transcript.

## **Registration Key Terms**

Academic Advisor: The staff member who will guide you through your degree. Academic Advisors

assist with course registration and degree planning, among other duties.

Add/Drop Period: A grace period at the beginning of each semester when you can add or drop a

course without penalty.

<u>Course Load</u>: The number of courses you are taking a semester.

<u>Credit Hour:</u> You may also see this referred to as "semester hour credit." Each course is

assigned a number of credit hours that measures the instruction and learning for

that course.

<u>Full-Time</u>: To be enrolled as a full-time student, you should register for at least **12 credit** 

hours a semester.

General Education: Requirements outside of your major that are chosen to give you a broad, "well

rounded" education.

Orientation: Required session/event where you will learn about campus resources, how you

are expected to behave on campus (also known as a code of conduct), and will

meet with an Academic Advisor.

<u>Pre-Requisite:</u> Course or placement you must complete before taking a course.

<u>Semester:</u> Measurement that divides the academic year into 15-16 week terms. The main


semesters are Fall (August through December) and Spring (January through May); however, there are also shorter semester (8 week) options for some

courses, as well as the Summer semester (May through August).

Semester Hour Credit: A semester hour credit is how college courses are measured. It is defined by the

Federal Student Aid Handbook as "one hour of classroom or direct instruction, plus a minimum of two hours outside class work per week, for fifteen weeks" (the

length of a semester).



• If you want to complete your degree within 4 years, without enrolling in summer courses, you should register for *at least* 15 credit hours for the fall (and spring) semester.

## **Step Two: Choose your Fall Courses**

1. Begin with the PRIORITY courses for your major. If those courses are full, you'll move on to the next step to continue registering for courses. You can check for open seats in priority courses until the first week of the fall semester.

#### Your PRIORITY courses:

IDSN 1180: Interior Design Fundamentals	Required for major - must register for both <b>IDSN 1180/1181</b> 3 credit hours
IDSN 1181: Interior Design Fundamentals Lab	Required for major - must register for both IDSN 1180/1181  Though listed as priority, seats will likely close quickly. Please do not panic if you do not have a seat in 1181. Email your academic advisor to be added to IDSN 1180 without the 1181 lab. You will still be able to take the 1181 lab in a subsequent semester and still stay on track for graduation if accepted into the program.  3 credit hours

## **Step Three: Additional Courses**

For financial aid, insurance, and tuition purposes, you will likely want to register for at least 12 hours minimum, although we recommend 14-16 hours. Please choose from first semester options below to create a schedule equaling 14-16 credit hours.

<b>ENGL 1100:</b> Foundations of College Writing	Choose one of these general education/major required courses to take during your first semester.
<u>Or</u>	You will be able to take the other course during your spring semester.
<b>HLTH 1000:</b> Health in Modern Society	3 credit hours
MATH 1050: Explorations in Math	General education math  3 credit hours
ECON 2113: Microeconomics	General education social science and required for major.  3 credit hours
PSYC 1000: Introductory Psychology	General education and required for major  3 credit hours

Even if you are on a waitlist, please be sure to register for an alternative or back-up course so that you are registered for at least 14-16 credit hours. You can always drop these alternate courses if you get into your waitlist course.
